MESSAGE FROM SIEN LOK ON BEHALF OF WING KEI NURSING HOME

better the lives of seniors in the community.

The Wing Kei Nursing Home Association has made excellent progress towards the construction of a 113-bed nursing home in the Calgary Health Region. The plan to build the nursing home has been in place since 1998, conceived as an equal partnership of the community, the province and the federal governments. The cost of the project is \$13.5 million, with the community-based funding component of \$4.5 million. Since the capital fundraising campaign was launched a year ago, \$3.1 million in pledges/donations have been accumulated. We thank you for the contributions.

The nursing home site has been purchased at 1212 Centre Street North. Once the \$4.5 million goal is attained, the provincial and federal funds become available to initiate the building process. The nursing home will be operated as a non-profit facility with admission governed by the Calgary Health Region.

We need your support by making a taxdeductible contribution to the Wing Kei Care Centre. We are proposing a "\$1-A-Day" contribution for 30 months, for a total pledge of \$900. We have developed several options to assist you in providing your donation. These include:

- 1. A one-time \$900 donation, or
- 2. \$300/year for three years,
- 3. \$30/month for 30 months, or

4. Any amount that you wish to make. A charitable donation tax receipt will be issued. We would like to invite you to be part of the \$1-A-Day campaign. **Premier Ralph Klein** is hosting a 10-course Chinese cuisine banquet in recognition of the donors to the \$1-A-Day Fundraising campaign on February 19, 2003 at the Calgary Chinese Cultural Centre. The evening with the Premier will start with a tour of the Cultural Centre Museum at 4:30 p.m., followed by a photo session at 5:00 p.m., and the banquet at 6:00 p.m. Other generous sponsors have donated the recognition banquet.
