Bylaws Update

As presented at our General Meeting, the Board has completed a thorough revision of the Society's Bylaws. Prior to this, the Society's bylaws had been untouched since the Society's inception.

Some highlights of the changes include:

- 1) The size of the Board can now be between five and 25 members.
- 2) Board and Executive powers are separate, but a Board member can also be an Executive.
- 3) Executive and staff can be remunerated, but a Board member in their capacity as a Director cannot.
- 4) There is no limit to the number of terms a Director may serve.
- 5) Directorship terms are two (2) years in length.
- 6) Provision for electronic communications such as e-mail, for all Board and Member communications.
- 7) A Quorum of the Membership is 5% of all members entitled to vote.

There are many other sweeping changes, and you are very much encouraged to read the new bylaws included with this edition of the newsletter.

These bylaws must now be passed by way special resolution, by you, the Sien Lok Members. In the interests of time and simplicity, this vote will be done only by regular mail, rather than in-person or by other means.

Included with this newsletter is a copy of the new bylaws, and a Proxy Form (voting form) for each member to fill-out and return by mail. The completed proxy is to be delivered to Sien Lok Society of Calgary, PO Box 20150, RPO Bow Valley, Calgary, AB, T2P 4H3, not less than 24 hours before the meeting (4:00 pm, January 31, 2004). Alternatively, the Member may deliver the completed proxy to any director of the Society for presentment at the Meeting.
